
2011 Mat-Su Salmon Science & Conservation Symposium Keynote Speaker



David Montgomery was the recipient of a MacArthur "Genius Grant" Award in 2008 and is a professor in the Department of Earth and Space Sciences at the University of Washington; he graduated from Stanford University in 1984 with a B.S. in geology and from U.C. Berkeley in 1991 with a Ph.D. in geomorphology. His research interests range from the co-evolution of the Pacific salmon and the topography of the Pacific Northwest to the environmental history of Puget Sound rivers, interactions among climate, tectonics, and erosion in shaping mountain ranges, and giant glacial floods in eastern Tibet. He is the author of <u>Dirt: The Erosion of Civilizations</u>, <u>King of Fish: the Thousand-Year Run of Salmon</u>, and the forthcoming <u>The Rocks Don't Lie: A Geologist Investigates Noah's Flood</u>.
