# What Makes Alaska's Salmon Rivers Resilient?



You are probably familiar with the phrase “*don't put all of your eggs in one basket.*” If the basket is dropped, all is lost. Just like farming and finances, there is stability in diversifying investments. The same can be said about salmon and investing in conservation of a broad variety of habitats for them. Through his research in Bristol Bay, **Daniel Schindler, PhD** at the University of Washington and his collaborators have documented this “portfolio effect” whereby the diversity of salmon streams and

salmon stocks that return to them leads to overall enhanced stability of annual salmon returns to the region. Come learn more about this idea and its applicability to Mat-Su salmon and the economies, livelihoods and ways of living that depend on them.
