Monday Keynote:

Dr. Peter Westley

Dr. Peter Westley is an associate professor of Fisheries with the University of Alaska Fairbanks College of Fisheries and Ocean Sciences where he holds the Lowell A. Wakefield Chair in Fisheries and Ocean Sciences. His research seeks to understand how fishes respond and adapt to environmental change, including invasive predators, climate change, and hatcheries, with a particular focus on Alaskan salmon. In his presentation, Dr. Westley will highlight key lessons of salmon conservation science that have emerged during the past few decades.

Tuesday Keynote:

Dr. Stephanie Quinn-Davidson

Dr. Stephanie Quinn-Davidson is a fisheries scientist and has worked in salmon fisheries in Alaska for over a decade. Her work focuses on sustaining Alaska's fisheries and those who depend on them, and elevating Indigenous perspectives and voices in fisheries policy, management, and advocacy. Quinn-Davidson has a PhD in Limnology and Marine Science from the University of Wisconsin-Madison and is currently the Program Director for Fisheries and Communities at Alaska Venture Fund. Stay tuned for specific details on Dr. Quinn-Davidson's talk.
